Vacation Bible School is a Lot Like Life

Vacation Bible School, I have decided, is a lot like life. It begins with a lot of possibility and uncertainty. You have some resources, and a general sense of what you want to do, and a lot of questions, like how? How does this all work? Who? Who will come and care about this? The when is maybe the easiest question to answer, but the answer you get doesn't work for everybody. The why is the question with the most solid answer. We VBS (yes, that is a verb, I just decided) and we live because we are created to live, and to grow in understanding our identity as beloved children of God. Henri J. M. Nouwen says, "...life is a God-given opportunity to become who we are, to affirm our own true spiritual nature, claim our truth, appropriate and integrate the reality of our being, but, most of all, to say "yes" to the One who calls us the Beloved."

We love, not because it is the nice thing to do, or the right thing to do, but because we are loved. God's love of us makes it possible to love others we don't know well, or who are difficult to love. VBS is a loving act that is possible because we know that God has done so much for us, and we want our kids to experience that love too. And they do! The loving kindness shown between the adults, the youth helpers, and the children in the VBS program this past month was astonishing. We ate and laughed together, encouraged each other, and learned about God's word and acts of creation together (Psalm 104).

The team of adults and youth working together really made the whole thing beautiful, taking ideas and lessons and shaping them to fit our group and the space we were in. And that is another thing that makes me think VBS is like life. How we interact with each other in community is one of the most important ways we say "Yes" to our creator. Nouwen says that if we are living life as if it is a painful test to prove we deserve to be loved, we only need to accept God's unconditional love for us and then live life as an unceasing "Yes" to the truth of that Belovedness.




NEW Simpson Community Shelter and Apartments

The Simpson UMC building has sheltered thousands of people over its years of operation, but the 130-year-old structure was never built to accommodate shelter guests. It's time to build something better on the site: the new Simpson Community Shelter and Apartments.

Plans for the four-story facility include 70 shelter beds; two floors (42 units) of deeply affordable housing; and extensive on-site services, including a 24-hour front desk, a commercial kitchen capable of serving 100 people, and offices/clinic space for Health Care for the Homeless, service staff, and community and cultural partners.

Simpson plans to break ground on the new shelter later this year. They are in the final phase of a \$45 million campaign. They have raised funding from several public and private sources but have \$13 million left. They are asking the UMC community to join them in making a financial gift to fully fund the shelter's Build-Up Campaign. UMC Aldersgate is providing a \$75,000 fundraising challenge match so each gift received from the UMC community by December 31 will be doubled!

Southern Valley Alliance (SVA) accepts <u>all old cell phones and</u> <u>smartphones</u>. These can act as an



emergency 911 phone, as well as offer access to the internet via Wi-Fi to use maps/GPS or order Uber/Lyfts. These phones can be a huge help to those in domestic violence situations. Please consider donating any you no longer use. Before donating, SVA asks that you reset the phone to the factory setting. If you're unsure how to do this, they can take care of it when they get the phones. They also ask for the charger (they will still take them if you don't have it.) There's a box on the ledge in the Narthex to collect any phones you wish to donate.

Core Team and Finance Updates...

The Core Team met on Monday, August 21. Highlights of the discussion included:

- Finance shared the news that transferring accumulated interest from some of our investment accounts
 has improved our income vs expenses standing. We are currently doing better than we were last year at
 this point. This is a temporary but helpful tool. We continue to look at options for online credit card
 giving.
- Vic Noer is taking over the job of chairing Trustees as Tom Grund is stepping back for health reasons.
- Big events coming up include Radical Hospitality training and appreciation night (August 31),
 Homecoming Sunday (Sept 10-hospitality), the Community Fall Fest (Sept 18-outreach), and a Fresh
 Expressions workshop (Sept 30) for learning how to expand our hospitality in church and in the
 community.

I recently was made aware of additional pledges for 2023. When you look at the spreadsheet you will see that our pledged money is now at \$171,866.00. And that really helps. And, thanks to Tina, I now get an accurate report on regular unpledged giving. Next month, the report may have a different look again. I am thinking of pie charts.

The following information was just given to me. I hope you find it informative. Of every dollar you give to the church, 84 cents stays with the church, 1 cent goes to other general funds (ex: World Service Specials and Special Sundays), 2 cents go to general apportionments and 13 cents go to jurisdictions, annual conferences districts. (This information is from the United Methodist Handbook.)

Starting in October, the group will meet the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month from 1:00pm-2:30pm.



When we became a Reconciling Congregation in April and formed the I Team, our primary goal has been to focus on Inclusion for ALL. We felt that the way to do this was to have each month focus on a different "marginalized" community. So far we have focused on Mental Health (May), Pride (June), Disability Pride (July), and Anti-Bullying (August). At our most recent meeting we discussed how our monthly inclusion emphases relate to our mission.

To answer this, we went back to our mission of developing a culture where **all** people feel welcome, safe and, most importantly, loved. This mission contains three important words –All/Safe/Loved. In order for us to build this culture, we need to focus on education, to build our knowledge. How can I learn to accept someone if I don't really have knowledge about their experiences? I can guarantee you that at least someone in our congregation has **personal** experience with whatever our emphasis for the month is. Honestly, many people in our congregation have experience with many of our months' emphases. How can we build a culture to make people feel welcome, safe, and loved, if we don't learn about and understand their story? As an I Team, one of our goals is to provide you with information. Check the monthly Bulletin Board and any pamphlets or hand-outs nearby.

The emphasis for September will be Memory Loss. Many, many of us have experienced this with a family member, may be experiencing it personally, or are very worried that we will be experiencing problems in the future. My mom was diagnosed with Alzheimer's when she was the age that I am now. She lived another eight years. She didn't know who we were, but she certainly enjoyed seeing us as we visited. She was physically very healthy until her last year and was fun to visit. What was sad was that her friends and even siblings were "afraid" to visit her in the nursing home. Her father also died from dementia-related issues, so that was part of the problem, but fear can and does drive people away. The Bulletin Board area will have several educational materials on Memory Loss, including pamphlets, advice, and local (Scott County) resources. Please feel free to take whatever you need. Let's be there for each other. Remember, Inclusion starts with I.
