#### **New Pastor Announcement**

The United Methodist Church, Minnesota Annual Conference, has announced that it is the intention of Bishop Lanette Plambeck to appoint the Reverend Linda Leigh Brown as minister of Holy Trinity United Methodist Church in Prior Lake. Acting on behalf of the congregation, our Staff Parish Relations Team has affirmed the Bishop's intention. Reverend Leigh is currently serving at Coralville UMC in Iowa, where she has served as their Pastor since 2015.

When the appointment was presented to SPRT, we found Pastor Leigh to be a perfect missional fit for Holy Trinity UMC. She has led two churches in their process to becoming Reconciling congregations; and more importantly to Holy Trinity, she has led them in living into their more Inclusive identity within the community. She is very excited about our Bread Oven Ministry, and is looking forward to her first pizza event in Prior Lake. She is most comfortable leading and working collaboratively with staff and laity, which is exactly how Holy Trinity works today.

In terms of transition, some of our dates are still "to be determined," but the known calendar items are:

- June 9th Pastor Chad's last Sunday preaching at Holy Trinity. Included in that service will be an Order of Farewell, followed by a "thank you Chad" fellowship time after the service.
- July 7th Pastor Leigh's first Sunday preaching at Holy Trinity. Included in that service will be a Celebratory Ritual of Welcome.
- TBD some time in August, Pastor Leigh's first pizza party.

Please help us welcome Pastor Leigh to Holy Trinity. Each church member's supportive prayers and acts of kindness during the transition period will be greatly appreciated by all of the involved persons.

#### **Inclusion Starts with I**

"LET'S THINK DIFFERENTLY"

The I Team focus for April is Neurodiversity. What does that mean?

According to Nicole Baumer, MD, MEd, and Julie Frueh, MD in an article on the Harvard Medical School website, Neurodiversity describes the idea that people experience and interact with the world around them in many different ways. There is no one "right way" of thinking, learning, and behaving, and differences are not viewed as deficits. Judy Singer, an Australian sociologist coined the term neurodiversity to promote equality and inclusion of "neurological minorities".

Autistic persons, people with ADH and other neurodivergent diagnoses are in our families, neighborhoods, workplaces, and churches. Better understanding the ways these persons want or need to relate to people, any unique challenges they may live with, and how we can support them will foster a welcoming church home for all.

Please take the opportunity to read the posted materials and take a handout located in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. In addition, on Sunday April 21st following worship you are encouraged and invited to join us at the parsonage for an exercise demonstrating how a neurodivergent mind responds to environmental stimuli. We will also feature conversation with members of our church community who are part of the neurodiverse community. Hopefully you will take away a new understanding of how challenging it can be to do an ordinary task when your brain functions differently.

This month and going forward let's all think differently, embracing and appreciating everyone's uniqueness. Remember, Inclusion Starts with I.



The Core Team met Monday, March 18 at 6:30 pm. Highlights of the discussion included:

- The Finance report shows a balance of -\$5,350 through the month of February. To date, \$5,775 has been pledged/donated to the "Close the Gap" campaign. The campaign has also generated a number of good ideas that will be reviewed at the next Core Team meeting.
- The Bread Oven Ministry has two events currently scheduled: pizza baking for Pastor Chad's last day at HTUMC (June 9), and cinnamon roll baking in September on the Sunday The Flames will be here. Additional dates/events were suggested: VBS, Night to Unite, STORM Camp. Tanya will talk to Rene about these opportunities.
- Information from a webinar attended by Tanya and Pastor Chad was shared. One key insight: churches are faltering because they are more concerned with self-preservation than self-donation. How might we think about using our facilities for greater missional impact?
- The I-Team will help us focus on neurodiversity during the month of April, including an interactive experience after worship on April 21. Ellie Krug will present "Gray Area Thinking" on the evening of May 5 at HTUMC. Members are asked to sign up by the end of March. After that, registration will be open to people from the community and other churches.

#### **Finance Update**

At the end of February our donations are lagging behind last year. Although our pledges for 2024 have increased from 2023, we are \$2427.23 behind last year, and are a minus \$5000.00 vs the budget for the year.

As of this writing, we have received 21 donations for Close the Gap, for a total of \$5775.00

The Close That Gap fundraiser is very important to the future of the Church. Except for 2022, we have been running a deficit. In 2022, the church received a grant for employee retention. That grant saved the year from being in the red.

We have \$92,000.00 in our General Fund. \$60,000.00 is a two-month reserve. That leaves \$32,000.00 available to us to pay bills. We will have to dip into that \$32,000.00 to pay some bills this month.

According to General Conference documents, in 2023, 1491 Methodist Churches closed for reasons other than disaffiliation. 237 closed because of financial reasons. I hope Holy Trinity will not be in that category.

During the conversations regarding the sale of a portion of the property, we heard over and over, how the church has gone through difficult times in the past, but how everyone stepped up. (continued above...)

This is that time again. It is time to step up. Maybe you are not able to help financially. But look for other ways. We want your ideas.

I am looking for a grant writer. I spent a good portion of my career working in the non-profit sector. But we always had someone who was responsible for writing grants. If that is you, contact me.



# Save the Date: STORM CAMP 2024

STORM Camp 2024 will be at Holy Trinity July 14-18 for kids who have finished 7th-12th grades, and adults

who want to make some lives better and be moved by amazing worship. STORM sends groups of five 7-12th grade youth and an adult driver to residences (and businesses, occasionally) with the tools needed to do a half-day to a day's work. We do things like yardwork, painting, cleaning, minor building projects and/or demolition. The staff team contacts those we're serving ahead of time and check the jobs, then they work with the teams who will do the work -typically checking in during the day and offering support as needed. We're not professionals, but pride ourselves on good work and good conversation with homeowners (as appropriate). STORM doesn't charge for our services (donations are accepted).
